

Main Findings from Studying at Home Survey

103 responses

1. Only 17.3% *regularly* feel confident that they know how to study.
 2. Only 29.8% *regularly* use a clear system for note-taking.
 3. Only 34% of fifth-years respond that they *regularly* are able to interpret the question/task correctly.
 4. 47.6% *never* set weekly targets. Only 11.4% *regularly* do so.
 5. 40.8% of students *never* share notes/resources when it comes to studying.
 6. Only 15.5% *regularly* compare and share work with classmates.
 7. 22.5 % of learners *never* note down areas in need of improvement following a test. A further 31.4% *rarely* do so.
 8. Only 7.8% *regularly* turn off mobile phones when studying.
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9. 80.8% *never* use school library to help them in their study.
 10. 68.9% *never* use flashcards to remember material.
 11. 44.7% *never* use mindmaps/graphs as a study aid.
 12. 26.2 % of students *never* cross-reference different sections in textbooks.

A further 34% *rarely* do so.
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13. 25.2% of students *rarely* use contents/index in textbooks.

A further 12.6% *never* do so.
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14. Relatively high levels of confidence at finding relevant material quickly online. 32% *regularly* confident and 45.6% confident *sometimes*.
 15. 66.4% of fifth-years *rarely* or *never* bookmark/save material they find online.
